

Course Guide September to December 2020



Covid-19



RALSS has assessed all the government guidance, together with information from Public Health England regarding the COVID 19 Pandemic.

The health and safety of our students is paramount and therefore measures are being put in place to make sure that whilst at RALSS everyone can remain safe. This may mean there will be reduced numbers on site and all staff and students will have to meet strict rules for hygiene, cleaning, personal protection and social distancing. We ask you to always abide by our new safety procedures.

What plans do we have for your protection?

- Classrooms will have limited capacity due to the need to comply with social distancing guidelines
- Some courses may be offered online fully
- A blended learning model is likely for some qualifications (ie a mix between classroom based learning and online delivery)
- Learners' workstations will be separated
- One-way system in the corridor
- Separate entry and exit
- Tutors will have their own equipment
- Tables and touch points will be cleaned between classes
- Hand gel dispensers in classrooms
- Toilets only available to one user at a time
- The vending machines may be restricted or disabled
- The water machine will be accessible but cleaned regularly
- Our community area during breaks will not be available

What will we ask you to do?

- We will ask you to enrol and pay by phone rather than in person if possible.
- Please do not attend on site if you have been in contact with anyone suspected of having the virus, or if you have any symptoms such as a cough, or loss of taste or smell.
- On arrival we will check your temperature before letting you join the class.
- You may be asked to wear a mask for certain activities.
- You may need to bring your own set of equipment for each class.
- We will have a one-way system in the corridors please keep left.
- You will be asked to leave via a different door to prevent contact with the next class entering the building.
- Breaks will be taken in your classroom please bring your own supplies and containers.

Fees

Our courses are subsidised by the Skills Funding Agency and, in some cases, there is no tuition fee to pay. Where a fee is paid, no refund is available for cancellations made by you after 1 week before the start date.

Maths and English classes are free to those who do not have a grade A-C, or 9-4, at GCSE.

Concessions for Community Learning courses

There is a 50% discount on course fees and some materials for those in receipt of State Benefits, or the unwaged dependent of someone in receipt of state benefits (NOT including Child Tax Credits), or with a gross Household Income of less than £25,521

If you are entitled to reduced fees as set out above, you will be required to sign a Declaration to confirm your circumstances and may be asked to provide proof. Making a false declaration could constitute fraud and lead to legal action.

Apprenticeships



Rutland Adult Learning & Skills Service offer apprenticeships in partnership with Stamford College

<u>Who are they for?</u> Apprenticeships are for anyone over the age of 16 living in England and not in full-time education. Employers can offer Apprenticeships to new entrants or use them to grow talent from among current employees. Apprenticeships are free to the learner as they are government funded, making an Apprenticeship an ideal route into a new job, or a way to develop your skills with your existing employer to progress your career.

"...As well as teaching me how to work in a business environment, how to engage with colleagues and the A-Z of office etiquette, doing an apprenticeship has also increased my confidence and given me a sense of job satisfaction that I feel very lucky to have at a relatively young age. I'd recommend doing an apprenticeship to anyone; it has set me up for life and was well worth pushing myself out of my comfort zone for!" - Business Administration Apprentice

Employers We offer a range of Apprenticeship Standards which have been designed to be relevant for each occupational area and the needs of your business. Government funding for Apprenticeships includes an employer incentive payment of £1,000 for employers taking on an apprentice aged 16-18, or 19-24 if on a Local Authority EHCP plan, or have been in care. If you have less than 50 employees, Apprenticeship training for those who fit the above criteria will be fully funded. For apprentices aged 19+ the government will continue to fund 95% of the apprenticeship programme whilst a 5% investment is required by the employer.

<u>EMPLOYER INCENTIVE</u> - In response to the COVID-19 pandemic the government has set about working towards economic recovery with a 'Plan for Jobs'. As a part of this measure, there will be new payments for employers who hire new apprentices. A new payment of £2,000 to employers in England for each new apprentice they hire aged under 25, and a £1,500 payment for each new apprentice they hire aged 25 and over, from 1st August 2020 to 31st January 2021. This will be in addition to the existing £1,000 payment the government already provides.

Other Qualifications

As well as apprenticeships, we can offer Certificates and Diplomas for anyone aged 19+. These can be undertaken if you are a paid employee or a volunteer working for at least 12 hours per week.

Business Administration

- Level 2 Diploma The level 2 qualification if suitable for those working in an administrative role who are looking to develop their skills.
- **Level 3 Diploma** For those with a more senior supervisory or support role who have some knowledge and experience of administration systems and who want to develop their skills.

Information Technology

- Level 2 Diploma Designed for those with little or no experience in computing for the underpinning knowledge that could aid progress to further education or employment.
- Level 3 Diploma Allows learners to select from a list of optional units to enable them to become a confident user across a range of information and communication technology and software applications

Early Years Practitioner

- Level 2 Diploma The aim of this qualification is to provide learners with the knowledge and understanding of babies and young children from birth to 7 years of age with applied knowledge in the early years, 0-5 years.
- Level 3 Diploma Prepares learners to become Early Years Educators, enabling them to work with and care for children from birth to 5 years and gain knowledge of children aged 5 to 7 years

Teaching Assistant

- Level 2 Certificate This qualification will enable the learner to develop the knowledge and skills needed when supporting teaching and learning in the school environment.
- Level 3 Diploma This qualification provides learners with an in-depth understanding of the knowledge and skills needed when working directly with children and young people in school and college environments.
- Level 4 Certificate for the Advanced Practitioner This Level 4 qualification aims to provide professional development opportunities for practitioners working in the school and college workforce.

Customer Service

- Level 2 Diploma Designed for those who work or want to work in the customer service sector
- Level 3 Diploma in Customer Service This qualification allows learners to learn, develop and practice the skills required in employment.

Funding

These qualifications may be free to learners up to age 23 without 5 GCSEs at grades 9 - 4 (A*- C) or a full Level 3 qualification. Alternatively, they can be funded using an **Advanced Learner Loan**.

Advanced Learner Loans

Loans are not subject to minimum household income. <u>Eligibility:</u>

- You're studying an eligible course for a level 3,4,5 or 6 qualification at an approved college or training provider in England
- You're aged 19 or over on the first day of your course, if your course started on or after 1st August 2016

Repayment

The earliest you will start repaying is either:

- The April after you leave your course
- The April 4 years after the course started, if you're studying part-time
- Repayments start when your income is over the threshold amount (currently £26,575 p/a)
- Interest will be charged from the day of the first payment
- Your repayments will stop if you stop working or your income goes below the threshold

Childcare Arrangements—Can we help?

Two-year-old early education funding

Parents who are receiving certain benefits will be able to apply for funded early education for their two-year-old. If eligible, the child will be able to attend an approved childcare setting for up to 15 hours per week during term time, or 570 stretched across the year. Universal three and four-year-old funding

All families in England with three- and four-year old children will be able to access funded early education at an approved childcare setting for up to 15 hours per week term time, or 570 hours stretched across the year. For full details visit childcarechoices.gov.uk
